Theme

Requirements

Submissions must be:

- Under six pages
- Written in 12-point font
- Double spaced

Eligibility

Any current Chicago-Kent student is welcome to submit their work for consideration.

Submissions & Anonymity

All submissions will be labeled and voted on anonymously.

Additionally, the winning submissions will only be announced with express consent from the authors.

Voting Process

The ACLU & ACPLS Executive Boards will vote to determine the top 10 submissions.

Afterwards professors and faculty will vote to determine the top two submissions.

Prize

The winning submission will be awarded \$100.00 and will also be able to select a charity to receive a \$100 donation.

The runner up will also be awarded a prize of \$80.
